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
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
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# The Domestic & International Political/Economic Feedback Loop

# **Commercial Actors Must Navigate an Emerging World of Nation-State Rivalries**

"Rivalry" between nation-states means a combination of: "relationship characterized by extreme competition, and usually psychological hostility, in which the issue positions of contenders are governed primarily by their attitude toward each other rather than by the stakes at hand.," "militarized interstate competition in which some cases are more enduring than others," and "a competitive relationship between independent states where both states identify the other as an enemy and an explicit threat."\* Rivalries are pervaded by a zero-sum mindset.

Characteristics of Rivalry With Elevated War Risk	Present in US-China Rivalry Today?
High level of resource mobilization against rival	Yes
Government identifies rival as top threat	Yes
Acrimonious array of intractable positional & territorial disputes	Yes
Two or more militarized crises/volatility points	Yes, incl. via alliance commitments
Elevated levels of defense spending, capabilities clearly target rival's military	Yes
Intense effort to build coalition targeting rival	Yes
Multiple parallel & overlapping rivalries	Yes






# Modern PRC Investment Footprint

# Russian/FSU Pipeline Gas Supplies Into Europe





# **Future Wars Could Be More Violent Than Ukraine**

### More Than 7,800 Cumulative Strike Munitions\* Used Thus Far



- In a US-China fight, mass, precision, and truly global strike capabilities will on be on the table.
- Consider the uplift in sheer kinetic violence relative to the last Pacific war:
  - Modern super/hypersonic anti-ship missiles pack a kinetic + warhead punch that can be 10X what a kamikaze aircraft or 18-inch battleship shell would have unleashed





# We Are Squarely In The Window of Maximum Danger

Action	Warning Timetable
Maritime Militia actions against Taiwan's outlying islands such as Pratas	Days
PLA blockade of Taiwan's outlying islands	Days
Invasion of Kinmen or other outlying Taiwanese islands	Weeks
Customs quarantine possibly escalating to maritime blockade of Taiwan	Days/Weeks
Missile/Air "exercises" to disrupt air and maritime traffic into Taiwan	Hours/Days
Full invasion of Taiwan	Weeks/Months






- Classic case of a corporate entity that does not want to choose sides but will likely be forced to as geopolitical dividing lines harden.
- Its commanding position in GPU technology makes it the premier "picks and shovels" business in today's unfolding AI gold rush.
- But the company's exposure to the China market raises pointed questions as to how its chips potentially help power the economy and military of the United States' Near Peer Competitor.
- And sales are higher than ever...
- Expect more export control attention from the Commerce Department in coming months.

### **Sector-Level Risks**

- Full Kinetic War (highest impact, lowest probability)
- Blockade/Embargo
- **Damaging Cyberattacks**
- **Export controls/sanctions**

# Firm-Specific Risks


- Employee detentions
- Raids
- **Boycotts**
- **IP Theft**
- Merger/Transaction approval withholdings ----
- Rejection of cargoes/punishment by demurrage
- Industrial espionage/passing of information to competitors
- Shadow business expropriation through "informal" regulatory action
